Stephan Mögle-Stadel, born in 1965, the Author of this remarkable Biography of the late UN Secretary General and Peace Nobel Laureate Dag Hammarskjöld served in his younger years the United Nations in New York City after refusing the German Military Service as a conscientious objector and a citizen of the world. He wrote a Psychoanalysis in his draft about the costs of militarism and ecological warfare.

Within the frame of his UN work he published in 1993 the



Boutros-Ghali book "UN-organized World" in German language as editor and a few years later in 2003 the book "UN-finished Road" by Kofi Annan. He was 1995 co-author and editor of the Futurology study "Is the Future still savable?" where his mentor Prof. Dr. Dr. Ossip K. Flechtheim was the main author. In the 90s he served the "Gesellschaft für Zukunftsmodelle und Systemkritik e.V." (Association for Future Scenarios and System criticism) as Chairman of the Advisory Board, was a long-time member of the "Erich Fromm Society for humanistic social psychology" and did research and media work for the Chairborad of the Club of Rome (CoR). He was CoB think tank member for two years.

His book "Die Unteilbarkeit der Erde" (**The indivisibility of Earth**) published in 1996 bears the subtitle "An Answer to the Club of Rome". In an interview with the German Newspaper "Süddeutsche Zeitung" in August 1996 Stephan predicted the clash of the financial capitalism markets in 2008. His specialty is psychohistory, an interdisciplinary field of research between depth psychology and futurological history analysis. In his private life he practices 3-D-chess, Tai Chi, Chan Buddhist mediations and Jnana / Kundalini Yoga.
